

## Brain Bee State Finals

Adelaide University

**The Australian and New Zealand Brain Bee Challenge (ANZBBC) is an annual competition for high school students in Year 10 (Aus) and Year 11 (NZ) that encourages learning about the brain and its functions. Students are introduced to careers in neuroscience and investigate the misconceptions about neurological and mental illnesses.**



On Friday the 21<sup>st</sup> of June, four Year 10 students took part in the ABBC State Finals, held at Adelaide University Health and Medical Centre. Two students - Hanna and Vivian - qualified in the top 55 in SA and participated in the individual state finals. We also all participated in the team challenge, where we were tested on our knowledge of nervous system and the brain. We also got a taste of what it was like to study neuroscience at the University of Adelaide, through attending a lecture, completing challenges and hearing from current neuroscience students. We learnt about the influence of alcohol through drunk stimulator goggles, the way brainwaves work through testing the blood-flow to and from the brain and the effect of optical illusions. We would like to thank Ms. Kennedy for taking her time to organize this splendid opportunity for us. Although we did not progress to the national competition, it was an incredibly valuable experience.
