Each day during the week, students from our Year 5 and 6 classes read to us information about Vietnam. They also read stories about Vietnamese people who came to Australia as refugees following the war. We acknowledge all people who have fled their own countries and arrived in Australia as refugees.

There are many people to thank who helped make our week such a success. We thank Sr Hieu who played a big part in organising and liaising with the Vietnamese community. On Monday our week started with Sr Hieu and a group of parents working with students from our Years 3, 4 and 5 classes to make cold rolls. Together they made cold rolls for all the Primary School students to try. We thank Binh and Thi Truong for donating all the ingredients to make the cold rolls and to our other cooks, Trinh Le, Hoa Nguyen, Sister Hieu, who helped demonstrate and guide the girls in the cold roll making.

On Tuesday and Thursday Sr Hieu taught all Primary classes a beautiful Vietnamese dance. Wednesday we were entertained by musicians playing traditional Vietnamese music.

Our week culminated with Primary classes working together to create Vietnamese arts and crafts followed by a shared Vietnamese banquet. We thank all the families from Years 3, 5 and 6 who generously gave their time to cook for us delicious Vietnamese



dishes. Twilight Assembly: We are all looking forward to next week's Twilight Arts Showcase Assembly. There will be email updates later this week.





MOBILE PHONES AND COLLEGE EXPECTATIONS

It is timely to remind our community about College procedures regarding mobile phone use and communication with your daughter/s during school hours.

SDPC Mobile Phone Policy

It is our preference that students do not bring a mobile phone to school. If for any reason, parents deem it necessary that their daughter carry a phone (such as after school safety), then **we require that the phone be turned off during the day and kept in a locked locker. The school does not take responsibility for lost phones.** Students may not use a phone during the school day for any purpose, unless under the supervision of a teacher.

Phone Calls Between Students and Parents

The mobile phone is **not** a means of bypassing College procedures. Should a student feel unwell, need to leave school early, or be out of school for part of the day, **a parent needs to phone the College Office.**

Students are permitted to make a call to parents when necessary **from the phone at the Reception Desk**, after authorisation from a Teacher or Office Staff. Similarly any messages from parents who phone the College Office, will be passed on to the student.
