University of Adelaide English Workshop | Monday 2 July

On Monday 2 July, the Year 11 Pre-Lit class and a group of Year 10 students attended the University of Adelaide's English workshop for prospective English students in high school. This workshop provided an insight into the University's English courses through well-informed speakers such as professors, teachers and post-graduates. The speakers advised students from multiple high schools on tertiary education benefits in English courses as well as possible career pathways that can be sought after completing some of these diverse courses. Students





received a bag with information booklets and food prior to entering the lecture theatre. Students were also able to listen to a theory on early interpretations of witches and feminism from a post-graduate's thesis. This educational experience has allowed us to grow as students, experience a university's supportive atmosphere, and discover new prospective career interests. We appreciated being able to attend the event and are thankful for the prospect of being active participants in large analytical discussions based around Shakespeare through his texts and personal life, poetry, in particular 'London' by William Blake, film techniques and literary techniques.
