Dear Parents,

I hope that you were able to join your children in some of the relaxing non-school days of the past two weeks. A special welcome back to staff who are returning after leave viz., Deputy Principal Curriculum, Rita Shepherd, and from the LOTE department, Mary Zora.

We have opened the door to a full and interesting Term Two. There is something significant for every one of us to contribute to this term's educational opportunities at St. Dominic's. Special events include: Parent Teacher conversations, NAPLAN Tests, the community's GALA DAY, the upcoming winter sports, the school drama production of Peter Pan, Mass for the Vinnies, the Parents and Friends Quiz Night, and much else besides. And, as you can see, across the road the construction of new Year 12 Centre at 74 Hill Street has well and truly begun, bringing to birth some long held dreams of the future for a school which, in its turn, has given so much to the life and fabric of North Adelaide since 1883.

## A Patroness for Term 2

Who better than Dominican St. Catherine of Siena whose Feast Day we celebrated this week. In a Catholic College for girls, Catherine offers young women a powerful example of a person who put her faith in to action. She was a woman who loved God and chose to come close to God in Jesus Christ. She understood in her everyday life that the only way of showing this love of God is to love the neighbour. An internationally renowned Dominican writer and speaker on Catherine's life and significance, viz. Sr. Mary O'Driscoll OP, puts the gifts of Catherine to the world in this way.

Although she was a prolific writer, Catherine did not receive any formal schooling and she learnt to read only after she became a Dominican. However, Catherine



was a remarkably intelligent and perceptive person with a retentive memory. Her learning came to her through oral sources, through the Liturgy, through the preaching of the Dominican Friars and through the



conversations she had with the theologians who were among her followers. She is an example of the principle that any person genuinely trying to live the Christian life, who has an active faith and a reflective attitude can do theology. In declaring Catherine of Siena, Doctor of the Church in 1970 Paul V1 recognised this principle.

#### Remembering Ray Romaldi

Our prayers and sympathy are extended to the Romaldi Family in the recent passing of Mr Ray Romaldi. St Dominic's is one of many schools in Adelaide that had the good fortune to be connected with Ray Romaldi, who was also a past parent and grandparent at St. Dominic's. He was one of nature's true gentlemen and a pioneer in the construction industry. Ray played a significant part in the developments large and small on our site from the late 70s through to the mid 90s, and we grew to know and to respect his integrity and craftsmanship. When he was working on our sites he would be there very early in the morning, the first person preparing for the day ahead. He was always interested in the school community and always ready to help you solve the problems along the way. He was a man with a ready smile. His final major project for St. Dominic's was the upgrading and creation in 1995 of large spaces in our former Convent building to become Drama and Music spaces, Year 12 facilities, a Staff area and an Administration centre. Thank you Ray. Rest in Peace.
