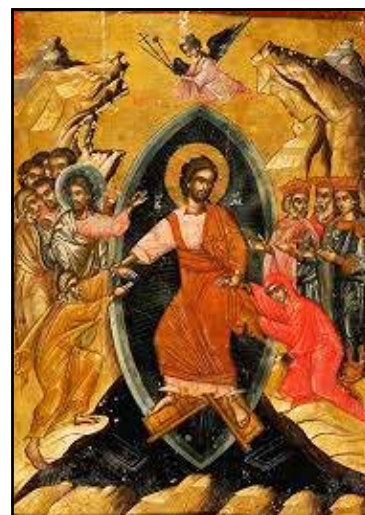

CHRIST IS RISEN ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA

Dear Parents,

I hope you enjoyed your Easter with a break and some time to spend with family and where possible with your Faith Community.

For our Eastern Orthodox Christians Easter is yet to be celebrated, this year on May 1st. Within our St. Dominic's community we have always been privileged to enrol students from the Greek Orthodox tradition. The Greek Easter Icon pictured here is called the Anastasis, (the Greek word for Resurrection). It is one of many painted over the centuries. This one is to be found in Malta at the Wignacourt Museum in Rabat. The Christ figure is resplendent, calm, strong and surrounded by an eager crowd of onlookers, prophets, saints and evangelists. The icon captures the drama and the exaltation of the Easter message of the Christ, risen and outside time and space. St. Gregory the Theologian, in an Easter sermon, captures in words the same spirit. *"The feast of Easter is for us the feast of feasts and the celebration of celebrations. It excels all other festivals as the sun excels the stars."*

MAKING HISTORY

Continuing the story and meaning of religious art, we are currently caught up in the restoration of the stained glass windows of the St. Dominic's Priory Chapel, opened in 1893. For the past 4 months the Annunciation window in the Lady Chapel has been undergoing urgent restoration. Designed by the renowned artist of stained glass William Montgomery, this window has shown major signs of deterioration which has increased in the past 2 – 3 years. As a result



of the work of *Adelaide Glass Painters – Stained Glass and Leadlights*, we are now watching, 123 years after their first installation, the wonderful restoration of the Annunciation Window to its early glory. The colours have always been striking but now, cleaned, and renewed by the replacement of all the lead which holds the glass together, they are truly stunning. If you have chance to slip into the Chapel in the morning or afternoon you are most welcome to come in. Pictured here are the leadlight restoration experts, lovingly securing the windows to their former position. We would also like to acknowledge the work of *G Force Building and*

Consultancy in the stone stabilisation which preceded the return of the lead light windows.

The Adelaide City Council Heritage Incentive Scheme also provided half of the cost of this major work.
