Those of you at St. Dom's in the mid to late 80s and were part of such co-curricular activities as netball, the vocal ensemble, the musicals "Godspell" and "Annie," and certainly those who graduated in 1988, will remember a fellow graduate, Simone Tur.

We are pleased and proud to let you know that Associate Professor Simone Ulalka Tur has recently been appointed Pro Vice Chancellor (Indigenous), at Flinders University. There is an excellent article about Simone's appointment in "Encounter," the annual magazine for Flinders University Alumni and Friends.

Former Senior History teacher Kathy Teague recalls Simone's thoughtful, able and inquisitive approach to study and her award in her senior years for oral History in South Australia. This award enabled her to continue her research on the Yankunytjatjara community in north – west South Australia.

During this time St Dominic's was privileged to become connected with Simone's Mother, Mona Ngitji Ngitji Tur. Mona always retained her ability to speak her mother tongue fluently and was able to spend a long career as a translator and interpreter.

In 1973 Aunty Mona began teaching Pitantjatjara at the Summer school of the University of Adelaide and began interpreting for the Aboriginal Legal Rights Movement.

St. Dominic's Old Scholars Association wishes Simone well in an active and successful role within our State and Nation.

The Dominicans of North Adelaide acknowledge,

that our buildings stand on land once inhabited by the Kauna people.
