

SCHOOL FEATURES

St Dominic's Priory College is a Catholic girls R-12 school of 679 students. The College strongly reflects the composition of the Australian multi-cultural community. Refugees from many parts of the world are welcomed, as are International Students.

The College is located five minutes north of the city centre in a quiet corner of North Adelaide. Founded in 1884 by Dominican Sisters from England, it has in common with Dominican Schools around the world, a long tradition of teaching and learning. The Dominican motto of 'Truth, and the pursuit of truth wherever it is found' is seen as essential to its philosophy of learning. Acting on that truth in outreach to the neighbour is the desired outcome of this pursuit. The opportunity to nurture character and confidence is enhanced by the College's moderate size. Education at St Dominic's is based on a deep respect for the unique qualities and gifts of each girl.

The College has an outstanding reputation in South Australia for the quality of its students' educational achievements across a broad range of learning areas. St Dominic's Priory College is committed to providing a balanced education where physical, intellectual and emotional growth are seen as complementary. Joy and enthusiasm are valued in the school's daily life and a wide range of co-curricula activities foster these goals.

The report presented here is a requirement of the Commonwealth Government as outlined in the Schools Assistance Act 2004. The College reports this data with pride in the significant achievements of staff and students.

It is presented under three headings: Professional Engagement, Student Learning Outcomes and Satisfaction.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

St Dominic's Priory College maintains a high level of student attendance. In 2020, the COVID-19 year, the average student attendance rate was 93.66%.

The College provides multiple channels by which student absence can be notified. When a student is absent without explanation, a SMS text message is sent to the Parent or Guardian seeking clarification of the reasons for the absence as well as a follow up phone call when required.

The percentage figure for the average student attendance rate, as shown in the table below, shows the proportion of days that each student, on average, attends school throughout the year. The larger the percentage the smaller the number of days that students are absent from school.



STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

SENIOR SECONDARY OUTCOMES

St Dominic's Year 12 students of 2020 achieved overall outstanding results. Thirty-six (36%) of the Year 12 class achieved an ATAR score of 90 and above (top 10% in the State). Nineteen percent (19%) achieved a score of 95 and above (top 5% in the State). Three (3) students were placed in the top 1% of the State, with ATARs above 99.

Over all 93% of all passes were of A and B grade standard.

Eighteen (18) Merits were obtained in the following subjects: *Biology, Chemistry, English, Essential English, Mathematical Methods, Music - Solo Performance, Physics, Research Project, Society & Culture, Visual Arts - Art, Workplace Practices.*

Thirty-one (31) Senior School students were awarded a VET Qualification.

Prominently displayed in the St Dominic's Administration foyer are the full range of subject achievements for 2020. We extend our congratulations to all Year 12 students of 2020.

YEAR 12 GRADE DISTRIBUTIONS 2020/2019








PROFESSIONAL ENGAGEMENT

EXITING STUDENTS SURVEY

Research indicates a strong positive correlation between student satisfaction and a school's operations. Exiting students' perceptions of school climate are important in understanding ways to improve school quality and satisfaction among students and teachers for future years.


A positive school environment empowers members of the school community to contribute to the ongoing improvement of the school and eliminating negative behaviours. The **Exiting Student Survey** is designed to provide schools with data useful for fostering a positive learning and working environment that promotes academic success among all students. Initial assessment provides a baseline, and ongoing assessment helps to determine whether programs are effective at improving the school climate, and whether they continue to be relevant for schools over time.

Performance of students is frequently reviewed; however, this only offers a snapshot and can often overlook the range of experiences, values and qualities that make up a school.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

CLASS OF 2020

Students at St Dominic's Priory College showed an overall mean satisfaction level of 69%. Compared with the Catholic Girls' Schools benchmark, satisfaction levels for St Dominic's exiting students were 7% lower. Percentage figures below indicate mean scores for each item.

Students at St Dominic's displayed the highest levels of satisfaction with the key area of *Student Behavioural Values*, and the lowest levels with the key area of *Technology and Resources*.

Percentage scores below indicate mean levels of satisfaction.

THE HIGHEST RATED ITEMS WERE FOR:

- My school is clearly identified as a Catholic School (90%)
- I have been encouraged to achieve high results (89%)
- My school has taught students how to be well-behaved (86%)

It must be noted that 2020 has been a very challenging year for Year 12 students, given the challenges of COVID-19. Therefore, it is important to take into consideration students' qualitative responses, rather than just focusing on the quantitative data of this report.



- This school is kept clean and tidy (89%)







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
