Dear Families,

On more than one occasion this past fortnight I have found myself smiling at the work I get to do each day.

How fortunate it is to work alongside men and women who work with a vision to ensure excellence in the school community. I have been meeting with the staff who hold a Position of Responsibility (POR) in the school. They are charged with leading learning and wellbeing. I have been so impressed by their knowledge, their commitment and their drive. We have discussed everything from how girls learn best, to providing rich resources and to leadership that makes a difference. Their work is impressive and I feel the College is in great hands.

How fortunate we are to have such expert teachers in the Multi Arts! Across the College there is much to celebrate in both the visual and performing arts. The most recent event, held on Wednesday evening, was the Primary Arts Showcase. What an absolute delight it was to see every Junior School girl take to the stage singing, dancing and playing musical instruments. Led by, outstanding Music Teacher, Anna Sordillo, and supported by all staff in the junior school, the Arts Showcase demonstrates student commitment, discipline, confidence, success and most importantly joy! I laughed, cried and clapped so hard my hands hurt!

How fortunate it is that St Dominic's Priory College remains committed to building school spirit through community events led by our Parents and Friends Committee. The meeting held on Thursday was overflowing with volunteers and enthusiastic parents ready to take on the all-important preparations for the College Fete to be held on Sunday 31 October. Lots of ideas and solutions were discussed and the energy was palpable. Our Quiz Night this Friday is set to be a lot of laughs and I look forward to seeing lots of parents in this setting.

How fortunate we are to be led by a College Board of Directors committed to providing excellence in leadership, vision and direction. I have this hope for St Dominic's girls – that they will go on to be highly educated Dominican women seeking truth for others and in doing so acting honestly and justly to bring forth the best in others and speaking up for those who need our voice. Let us offer our prayers for the Murugappan family.

## PRAYER & LITURGY



### FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI

On the first Sunday of June, the Church celebrates the solemnity of the Feast of Corpus Christi; the presence of Christ with us in the celebration of the Eucharist. The feast of Corpus Christi gives us an opportunity to remember the life and death of Jesus. In the celebration of the Eucharist we are reminded that Jesus continues to remain with the Christian community and indeed with the world community. Jesus is truly present with us in the Eucharist. At the Eucharist we come together at the one table to hear and share the Word of God from the Scriptures. Then through the breaking and receiving of the bread in the Eucharistic meal we are reminded that no matter how important or how small we are, we are all one in Christ and equal in the sight of God.

The Dominican Sisters of North Adelaide established our special St Dominic's Priory Chapel in 1884. The Sisters have a special devotion to the Feast of Corpus Christi. This is evident in the altar that they commissioned for our Chapel (pictured above right). Here, we



can see three separate stone carvings, each one represents a meal with Jesus and his followers. If you look carefully at the altar you will see, Jesus changing the water into wine at the Wedding Feast of Cana, the miracle of the feeding of the five thousand people and the central carving, the image of Jesus and his friends at the last supper.

Let us continue to celebrate the Eucharist as a joyful community and one that responds to the call of Jesus in the Gospels where Jesus challenges us to be a community of love, kindness, generosity and compassion.

## NEWS FROM TEACHING & LEARNING

### RELIGION FACULTY REPORT

There has been much learning across a variety of topics for all students in RE classes. Below is a summary of some of the experiences that have taken place this semester.

#### YEAR 7 – A CHAPEL TOUR WITH SR JILLIAN

During Term 2, each Year 7 class has had the wonderful opportunity to visit our College Chapel facilitated by Sr Jill. The girls developed an appreciation of the Chapel architecture, as well as learnt about history of the Chapel and the significance of the sanctuary and High Altar. It was also a great opportunity for the students to develop a connection with the North Adelaide Dominican sisters.



#### YEAR 8 – SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

In Year 8 Religion this term, students have been working on creating a non-fiction picture book to educate younger students about the Sacraments of Initiation and their importance within the Catholic Church.

#### YEAR 9 – THE JEWISH JESUS

In Term 1, RE for Year 9's focussed on the Jewish Jesus – looking at the challenges Jesus faced in bringing about his understanding of God and God's kingdom of love. Students were required to produce an 'artefact' they might find on an archaeological dig in the Holy Land and connect that artefact to a scripture passage about how Jesus was bringing about the Kingdom of God. The creative items ranged from quills used to write the Hebrew scriptures to pottery shards and even a completely reproduced sandal from the first century.

#### YEAR 10 – PRAYER SPACES

As part of the Prayer life of Jesus unit, students were asked to work in groups to design a sacred prayer space and prepare a short prayer ritual to share with their peers.

In doing so, the groups were tasked with selecting a theme to form the basis for their prayer ritual and then carefully select colours, symbols, scripture readings and reflective music to complete their ritual and sacred prayer space. The themes chosen by each of the groups varied, the celebration of multiculturalism and racial equity, friendship, St Francis of Assisi and respect for our natural environment and the beauty of creation.

#### YEAR 11 – CARE FOR OUR GLOBAL FAMILY

Term 2 has allowed the Year 11 students to explore the Catholic Social Teachings and reflect upon how they relate to issues in our society today. Students have been working on creating a social action or awareness campaign for a social justice issue of interest to them. Their creations will be presented at a year level expo later in the term.

#### YEAR 12 – STAGE 2 RELIGION STUDIES

Students have currently been examining the Bible as Sacred Text. Here are a few snippets from their recent sources Analysis:

You can use the Ignatian Contemplation exercise on a non-Synoptic Gospel, John 5:1-9, ... [where you] will accompany Jesus on the Sabbath day as he meets the sick man, witness him heal the sick, and understand that Jesus' compassion overshadows the laws. - **Monica N**


